Another week has come and gone! They are quite literally flying by. It really is a pleasure to have all of the children back in school and learning.

I wanted to say a huge thank you again for all that you are doing to support the changes and amendments that we are making as we discover the pinch points in the routines that we have in place.

You may have seen the news nationally about the increase in cases. This is obviously a concern but perhaps not entirely unexpected. From hearing stories from other Headteachers across the country (you have to love the power of Twitter!) the challenge when receiving news of a positive case is how to manage this with the least amount of disruption as possible. Although we are operating Year Group bubbles at lunchtime, the arrangements we have in place should mean that if we had a confirmed positive case, we would only need to ask the Class to self-isolate for 14 days. We would obviously need to confirm this with Public Health England, but this seems to be common in schools of our size that have reported positive cases so far.

# School actions if a child returns a positive test

- Please notify the school as soon as possible. Email <a href="headteacher@palacewood.kent.sch.uk">headteacher@palacewood.kent.sch.uk</a> as soon as you have confirmation of a positive test result (this includes evenings and weekends)

- The class bubble will immediately be closed. A ParentMail will be sent to the class informing them of the closure and the next steps.
- A ParentMail will go to the whole school informing them of a positive case.
- School will contact PHE as soon as possible to discuss next steps.
- If further bubbles need to self-isolate, then this will be shared at the earliest opportunity.

#### Oaks and Acorns one-way system

To avoid 'pinch points' at drop off and pick up, we ask that parents follow a one way system.

In Acorns, this would be walking from Talbot Road, past Giraffes class and onto the playground, and then leaving via the gate at the top of the playground and walking towards the bike shed, following the path back round towards Talbot Road.

In Oaks, please enter the school site via the 'ramp' gate and leave the school site using the 'stepped' gate. We understand that parents with buggies and pushchairs will need to use the 'ramp' gate for both entry and exit.

Finally, please do not linger at the gate, especially after exiting as this can cause a bottleneck and cause difficulties with social distancing.
