## How to help your children

I mentioned last week about some workshops for parents on supporting how children learn. The first two sessions will be on memory and how this works in relation to how children learn. The session will last about 30-40mins with an opportunity for questions – so allow approximately 1 hour.

We will use Zoom for these sessions, and I will run Session 1 on Memory twice on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> October to try and meet the needs and times for all parents. The first session will be 12:30-1:30 and the second session will be 7:30pm-8:30pm. The links to the meetings will be in the body of the ParentMail rather than here to keep the links more private.

Session 2 will be in the following week and I will provide more information in next week's newsletter.

## And finally

Last week, I sent out a survey about Statutory Assessments for children. I really believe that they are not necessary this year and that we should focus on teaching the children and building on our own assessments. Thank you to everyone who completed the survey. I thought the results from our school were really interesting. You can see them here.

  - Children's physical health **85%**
  - Children's mental well-being **97%**

  - SATs and other formal government tests taken under exam conditions in the Summer Term: **0%**
4. Should formal tests be cancelled to allow children to spend that time catching up on learning?
  - Yes: **94%** No: **3%**
