COVID update

As we continue to be faced with the increasing challenges of the Coronavirus, I just wanted to add in a timely update and reminder.

- If your child or anyone in your household starts showing symptoms (temperature, new and continuous cough or loss of taste/smell), the entire household need to self-isolate. Only the person displaying symptoms needs to get a test.
- If the test result is negative, then the household can return to normal providing you feel well enough.
- If the test result is positive, then the household need to self-isolate. Please inform the school if a member of your household tests positive. Action in school only needs to be taken if a child or staff member has a positive test, but we would still like to know as it helps us in preparing.

 as soon as the test outcome returns as positive, even if this is at evenings and weekends. The sooner we have the information, the more time we have to take the appropriate action.

Children will only have to isolate from school if they have been a close contact of a child or adult, who tests positive within their infectious period. This period is 48 hours prior to symptoms.

I am sure that you will have seen, read or heard of the increase in cases and school bubble closures across Kent and Maidstone. We are taking as many steps as we can to prevent closing bubbles but we need to be prepared that this is something that is likely to happen at some point. All I ask is that you continue to support the school in following the procedures that we have in place, and also observe the national guidance outside of school. There have been a couple of things brought to my attention this week:

- Please follow the one way systems onto and off of the playgrounds in Acorns and Oaks. In Acorns, enter the playground coming past Giraffes classroom and exit the playground by heading to the top of the playground and around. In Oaks, enter the playground by coming down the ramp and exit the playground using the steps (if you have a buggy then you can exit using the ramp).
- Please observe social distancing. On the playgrounds in the morning I still see many parents within 2m of each other, and often within 1m. This is for your own protection as well as ours. If you are within 2m for 15mins or longer or within 1m for any length of time, you will be classed as a close contact if there is a positive case. Wearing a mask does not change this.

Thank you so much for your support. I cannot tell you how grateful that I and all the staff are that you continue to follow our guidance and help us to stay safe.
