Dear Parents and Carers

It has certainly been an interesting week of weather this week but the learning hasn't stopped as you will see from the photos and comments below. Even today, between the downpours and torrential rain, the children have been using the outside space to continue investigating minibeasts in EYFS, PE lessons further up the school and some maths learning on measuring!

We are now all aware of the new Delta covid variant and the increase in infection rates in our local area. This is leading, as in our school, to bubble closures across the county and I suspect this will continue throughout the rest of this term. We are doing our best to minimise the disruption this causes to learning and will switch to remote teaching straight away in the event of a year group bubble closure. We have reinforced, with all staff and children, the need to continue following our covid risk assessment. Currently, I have no plans to return to class bubbles but this may change if the local situation becomes more challenging.

We were disappointed that 'Freedom Day' has been postponed and this has meant that we, again, have needed to look at the events we had planned for later in the term and adapt accordingly. This does mean that, with regret, we will not be able to invite parents on site for the Year 6 Leavers' Assembly or any transition activities.

Guidance from the DfE and KCC have made it very clear that transition meetings for Year R and Year 6 should be postponed. We are in discussion with secondary schools as to how this will look and I will update you as soon as I have any information.




