Dear Parents and Carers,

As you will be aware, I'm currently at home isolating and for someone who is a bit of a workaholic this is new territory! We still have high numbers of pupil absence as a result of covid and every day this week another member of staff has tested positive.

As you may have seen in the news, the national picture is no different and there does seem to be a significant uptick in cases amongst school children, particularly in primary schools. We are fortunate to have several student teachers, training with us across the school, and with the support of teachers and teaching assistants all of them have stepped up and taught classes over the last couple of weeks. They have been amazing – thank you.

On a different note, The Queen's Green Canopy is a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022. This nationwide programme encourages people from across the UK to Plant a Tree for the Jubilee. The national tree initiative will see trees being planted by individuals, community groups, schools, businesses and councils to create a network of trees that will help support the environment and fight the climate crisis. There will be specimen trees, avenues, copses and woodlands being planted to commemorate The Queen's 70 years of service to the nation. Existing woodland will also be dedicated to Her Majesty, so that, forests will be preserved for the future. Kent County Council is working with a range of partners to deliver the initiative for the county and is keen to include schools in the work. We have expressed an interest in being involved in planting trees to mark the jubilee and are looking for a keen and willing parents to also be involved in the initiative. This may include galvanising a few troops to plant the saplings if we are chosen. Please contact me, if you would like to be involved in this historic project. 



YEAR1




