

EYFS



The children have welcomed some new friends to the outside area in the shape of tadpoles. The children are so excited to watch them change and grow.

YEAR 1

This week we have been learning about time; telling the time, the passing of time, seasons and months of the year. We have started a new text in English. We carried out a great investigation about melting in our Science lesson.





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YEAR 2

This week during maths year 2 have been learning about money. We completed a range of recognising and counting pence and pounds fluency, reasoning and problem solving activities using coins and notes. Next week we are going to use this new learning to do some finding totals of amounts of money and some comparing.



YEAR 3



This week we have been beginning our own plan to write instructions for keeping healthy. In Maths we have begun looking at measure and reminding ourselves what mm, cm and meters are. In Science we discussed how plants adapt to survive in their habitats. In Geography we managed to find both advantages and disadvantages of living near a volcano!




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YEAR 4

YEAR 5




Year 5 have had a very busy week with more learning on fractions in maths. As we have been learning so much over the term, we looked at consolidating this learning using journaling. This showcase what the children could not only do but explain.

The children have also been reading Exploring space in novel study, writing their own stories and learning about biomes in geography. See if they can tell you which biome we live in!



This week in Year 6, we have been busy getting to grips with algebra. The classes have embraced this challenge and made amazing progress. We have explored the factors that led to the end of WW1 and the signing of the Treaty of Versailles. In science, we have been investigating what happens when you change components in an electrical circuits.

Waste Wednesday Update

Thank you everyone for collecting your waste, you are all doing amazing. We have now reached 5.9kgs of waste collected. It would be great to collect 6.4kgs by next week as this would mean that we have doubled the amount of waste saved from incinerators and landfill in comparison with February.

We have just signed up to a new scheme called The Carex Recycling programme. This means that you can for instance bring your empty Carex refill handsoap pouches on Waste Wednesday.
