Dear Parents and Carers,

Rather than write separate emails I have included below several items for information or action.

I am sure many of you noticed the traffic warden on Ashgrove this afternoon. I have had several emails, from residents, about parking in the last few weeks. Cars are being parked across driveways, on the zig zag lines and very close to junctions. As you will be aware, each of these actions goes against the rules of the High Way Code. Continuing to park in this way is dangerous and could result in a serious accident. I am asking that all parents are mindful of the rules of the road and behave in a way that is considerate to all.

Please could all children's clothes and bags be labelled with their name. Now that we have started forest school, children are sometimes needing to change clothes during the school day. Making sure children take the correct items home again is proving tricky if they are not named. Please also label your child's school rucksack.

Over the last year we have been able to show some leniency with regards to term time holiday. There is now an expectation, from the Department of Education, that attendance will return to pre-pandemic levels. This means that holidays taken during term time are likely to result in a fine being given and they are unlikely to be authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances.

It is our Harvest Celebration on the 4th October and we will be collecting donations from Monday 26th September. If you can spare some canned or dried food, toiletries or cleaning products we would be very grateful. Any items donated will be delivered to the church, by the children, on 4th October.

Next Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday is the first of our Tea and Read sessions with year 3. We look forward to welcoming parents into school on their chosen day. Please come to Oaks reception on each day.





Chloe has passed stage 3 swimming. Well done!



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


