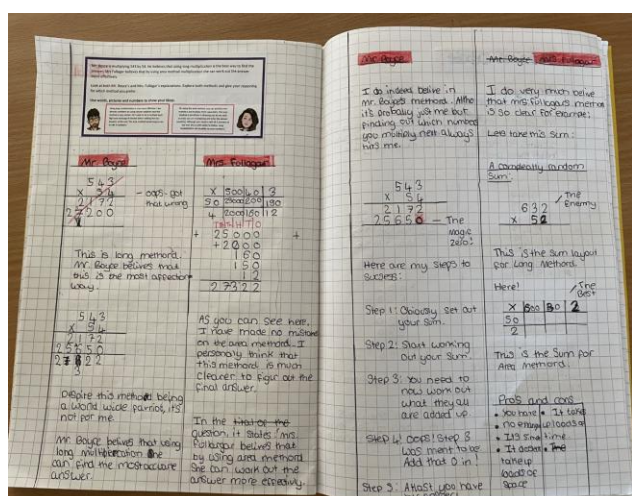
YEAR 4

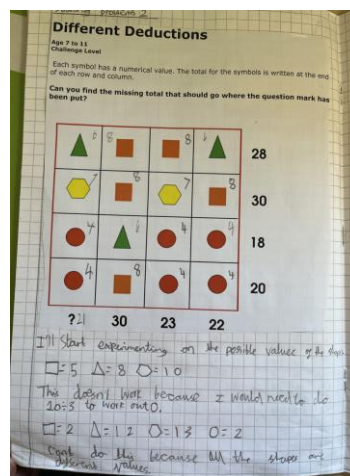


YEAR 6
